A Child's Understanding

A United Methodist bishop tells about the time his 5-year-old granddaughter followed along as the congregation stepped forward to receive Communion. When he asked her why she came to the Lord's Table, she said she just wanted to say 'Hi to Jesus.' As we celebrate Communion today what do you want to say to Jesus?

According to Fox's Book of Martyrs, the following followers of Jesus all suffered physical persecution:

- James, the son of Zebedee, the elder brother of John, and relative of the Lord was beheaded. It is said that on his way to be martyred, James' accuser was so impressed by his courage and conviction that he repented of his sin, professed himself to be a Christian, and was beheaded along with James.
- Philip was scourged, thrown into prison, and afterwards crucified, A. D. 54.
- Matthew was slain with a halberd (a sword-like weapon) in the city of Nadabah, A. D. 60.
- James the Less, at the age of ninety four was beat and stoned by the Jews; and finally had his brains dashed out with a fuller's club.
- Matthias was stoned at Jerusalem and then beheaded.
- Andrew, the brother of Peter, was crucified on a cross, the two ends of which were fixed transversely in the ground. Hence, St. Andrew's Cross.
- Mark was dragged to pieces by the people of Alexandria.
- Peter, it is thought, was crucified upside down at his own request because
 he did not feel worthy enough to be crucified in the same manner as His
 Lord.
- Paul was beheaded.
- Jude was crucified.
- Bartholomew was cruelly beaten and then crucified.
- Thomas was martyred by being thrust through with a spear.
- Luke, it is believed, was hanged on an olive tree.
- Simon was crucified, A. D. 74.
- Barnabas was put to death about A. D. 73.
