In Love Does (Thomas Nelson), Bob Goff describes his childhood interactions

In Love Does (Thomas Nelson), Bob Goff describes his childhood interactions with a storekeeper. Goff would choose some candy, spread his change on the counter and let the man count out what was owed. One morning, judging by the man's face, Goff could tell there wasn't enough money.

"We're one penny short," the storekeeper said. After a long pause, he took one of Goff's pennies, rubbed it with some vinegar and revealed a coin that looked brand new. Returning it to the pile, the man said, "In my store, shiny pennies are worth double."

Goff says that was an important lesson about Christians' role in Jesus' economy, where the poor are rich and we must give to receive: "We get to decide that people, including ourselves, are worth more than others might figure and that following Jesus means doing the math differently sometimes," he writes. "Because actually we're all on the same side of the counter when it comes to needing a little help and grace and a shiny penny now and then."
