# Before All Else Fails ...

In Too Busy Not to Pray (InterVarsity Press), Bill Hybels cites reasons that prayers may seem to go unanswered (unconfessed sin, selfishness and so on). The most common cause, though, is prayerlessness:

"People often tell me how they have attempted to address a pressing need," Hybels writes. "They have gone to counselors, read self-help books, claimed biblical promises, practiced self-discipline, confided in Christian friends, practiced assertiveness or submission or self-denial or positive thinking, even read books about prayer — and their need is still not met." But when asked if they've prayed "fervently and regularly" about the matter, the answer is usually no.

James 4:2 says, "You do not have because you do not ask God." So instead of thinking "When all else fails, pray," try this: "Pray before all else fails."

### Move the Fence

In Europe during World War II, two soldiers attempted to provide a decent burial for their buddy. At a nearby village, they found a cemetery next to a church. When the friends asked for permission to bury their friend there, the pastor said that wasn't possible because the soldier belonged to another denomination.

Sensing their disappointment, the pastor agreed to bury the soldier in a grassy area beyond the cemetery. "It's just outside the fence," he said. The two friends accepted the offer and vowed to return.

A few weeks later, when they came back to the village, they couldn't locate the new grave. The pastor quickly calmed them down. "Everything's all right," he said. "After we buried your friend, I kept thinking about him. So I came out here, and I moved the fence."

Denominational divisions often keep us from interacting with other Christians. The next time you have the opportun-ity to fellowship with someone who's different from you, remember this story. Take a bold step and move the fence.
