# What's Your Cell Type?

The microscopic amoeba is a self-sufficient, one-celled organism. White blood cells look much like amoebae yet serve the larger organism of which they're a part. While the amoeba flees danger, white blood cells hasten toward it, working together to defend the body from disease.

Individuals, the smallest units of the body of Christ, are like cells. They can either live for themselves or work together to serve the whole church. Although the body parts Paul mentions in 1 Corinthians 12 (ear, eye, foot, hand) can't live apart from the body, cells have that potential.

Do you focus only on your needs, deriving benefits from the body of Christ but not helping it? Or are you a team member, giving of yourself to benefit the whole church? Paul calls such people ministers and deacons (see Romans 12:6-7; 16:1).
