

Finding Meaning in Surrender

Swedish diplomat Dag Hammarskjöld, the second secretary-general of the United Nations, was known for his Christian faith and his efforts as a peacemaker. He received the Nobel Peace Prize posthumously after dying in a plane crash in Africa en route to negotiate a cease-fire.

In Markings, his published diary, Hammarskjöld wrote not of his illustrious career but of his conversations with God. He expressed concern about finding meaning in life and living a life filled with meaning. On Pentecost in 1961 (just months before he died), Hammarskjöld wrote: "But at some moment I did answer Yes to Someone — or Something — and from that hour I was certain that existence is meaningful and that, therefore, my life, in self-surrender, had a goal."

Get Involved

A cartoon pictured a beggar on the streets of a big city. The beggar was holding a sign which read:

"Know the joy of giving without the slightest risk of involvement."

Sounds enticing, doesn't it? "Give money to a poor fellow like me," implied the sign, "then go on your way with the warm satisfied feeling you get from giving — without any involvement at all."

Think about it. There's nothing wrong with giving and moving on. But what if one did occasionally choose to become more involved?

I think of a homeless man who came to our church for a shower. Some of our church members took time to get to know him, to hear his story, to befriend him and encourage him.

One day he told them that he was giving up his lifestyle. He said that he came from a family of means, but there had been an argument. He had walked away angry, without anything but the clothes he wore.

The friendship of the Christians, their acceptance and encouragement, made him want to be reconciled with his family, so he telephoned home. His father invited him back and even sent a plane ticket. He went home to be part of the family again.

Sometimes involvement is as good as a monetary gift. Maybe better.
