
Every Box Checked

Just before graduating from seminary, Dan Bogre received visits by denominational representatives across the country. Each one gave him a list of about 20 types of ministry from which to choose.

Interestingly, Bogre checked every box placed before him. "I thought to myself that I wasn't going to be pigeonholed by a survey form," he said. At the time, Bogre thought he could do any style of ministry.

Later, as an ordained pastor, Bogre began to realize that God had a specific ministry for him. However able he was to do several different types of ministry, he began to understand he was best suited for helping a church grow.

How many boxes would you check? How many ways are you willing to try to help your church and community? Sometimes checking a box outside your "comfort zone" can lead to unexpected but rewarding new paths.
