
When our lives are over, God won't ask us why we weren't a Mother Teresa or another saintly soul. He simply wants us to be who he created us to be.

As we all know, Hurricane Harvey slammed into the Texas coast last week as a category-4 storm, dumping 20 trillion gallons of water on the city of Houston alone. The storm made landfall three times in Texas and Louisiana, killing at least 39 people and forcing more than 1 million people from their homes. Church of the Nazarene leaders are on the ground in Texas assessing needs as volunteers from across the state mobilize to assist their neighbors in need. Nazarene Compassionate Ministries via Nazarene Disaster Response has sent hundreds of Crisis Care Kits to the Houston area.

Nazarenes Respond to Harvey

At least eight Nazarene churches were affected, and some of the most-affected areas have yet to be reached.

"We do have several churches with storm or flooding damage," said Jeffrey Johnson, district superintendent for the Church of the Nazarene in South Texas. "Many of our brothers and sisters have flooded homes."

USA/Canada Regional Director Bob Broadbooks requested prayer for families and individuals in the affected communities. "We encourage the church to join with others in prayer for those affected and first responders," he said. "This flood is of historic proportions here."
