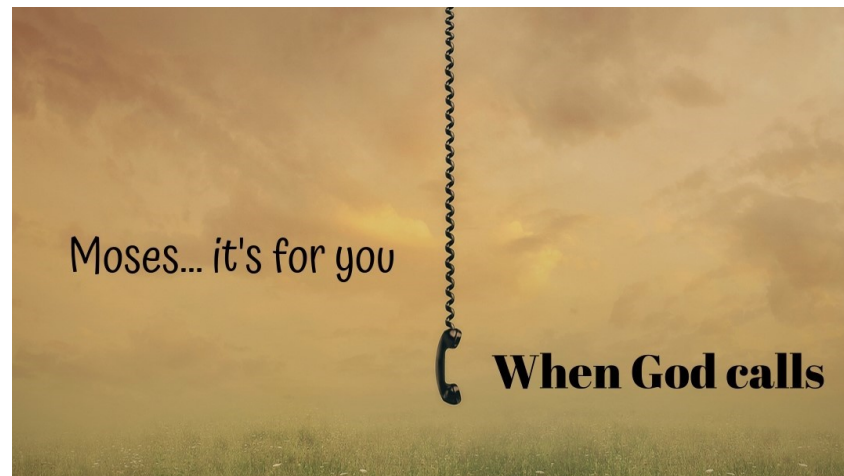

Christian Symbol - Serpent

A serpent coiled around a fruit-bearing tree symbolizes humanity's first sin, when Adam and Eve, at the serpent's tempting, disobeyed God by eating fruit from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. The Genesis 3 account is often referred to as “The Fall,” and though it doesn't say so, the serpent is commonly understood as Satan.

Billboards for Jesus



An online search for “advertising fails” reveals some hilarious and cringe-worthy signs. Often the “fail” is due to an ad's placement. For example, a billboard about childhood obesity appears next to one for a fast-food restaurant, and a promotion for The Walking Dead is posted near a mortuary.

As Christ's ambassadors on earth (see 2 Corinthians 5:20), we serve as walking, talking billboards for Jesus and our faith. Despite our sinfulness — and often “cringe-worthiness” — Jesus lives in us, whom he created to do good works (see Ephesians 2:10).

Even though we will never be perfect billboards for Jesus, let's not cover up our message. Instead, let's embrace the privilege of being salt and light (see Matthew 5:13-16), proclaiming the gospel in a dark world.
